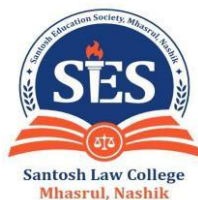

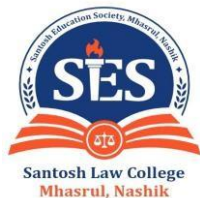

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CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION

Sr. No.	Time of Cancellation	If the vacant seat is filled by another candidate before the last date, the following amount will be deducted
1.	From 1st day to 10 th day from the date of commencement of the course	20% of the total fees.
2.	From 11th to 30 th day from the date of commencement of the course	40% of the total fees.
3.	After 30 days (No refund of fees)	100% of the total fees.

Change of Subject: After the process of admission is over a student may be allowed to change a subject. For this the student shall have to put in an application to the Principal giving reasons for such a request. After due consideration the change may be permitted.

Code of Conduct

Central government scholarship for SC/ST/NT Students:**

SCHOLARSHIPS & CONCESSIONS

Online submission of scholarship forms shall be done at the college office.

Central Government Scholarship for SC/ST/NT Students

This scholarship is available for students belonging to Government-notified SC/ST/NT categories such as Mahar, Mang, Chambhar, Dhor, Bhil, Mahadev Koli, Gond, Phase Pardhi, etc. It is provided by the Director, Social Welfare Department, Government of Maharashtra.

If a student receiving this scholarship fails in the examination, he/she will not be eligible to continue it. Eligible students should obtain the application form at the time of admission and submit the duly filled form to the college office.

Krantijyoti Savitribai Phule Scholarship

This scholarship is available only for girl students who have secured more than 50% marks and whose annual family income is below ₹75,000. A student can avail of this scholarship only once during her academic career. The student must not be availing any other scholarship to be eligible.

Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Swayam Yojana

The **Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Swayam Yojana** is a welfare scheme introduced by the Government of Maharashtra to support students belonging to the **Scheduled Tribe (ST) category** who are pursuing higher education.

Eligibility Criteria

Students must fulfill the following conditions:

- Must belong to the **Scheduled Tribe (ST)** category.
- Annual family income should be **₹2,50,000 or less**.
- The student must be admitted to a **recognized college or university**.
- The student should **not be staying in a government hostel**.
- Aadhaar number must be **linked with the student's bank account**.

Benefits Provided

Under this scheme, eligible students receive financial assistance for:

- **Accommodation (rent or hostel expenses)**
- **Food expenses (mess charges)**
- **Stationery and study materials**

This support helps students manage their daily educational expenses while staying away from home.

Mode of Payment

- The scholarship amount is **directly transferred to the student's bank account (DBT – Direct Benefit Transfer)**.
- Aadhaar linkage is mandatory to ensure smooth and transparent transactions.

Duration of the Scheme

- The benefits are provided for the **entire duration of the course**, subject to satisfactory academic performance and continuation of eligibility conditions.

Important Instructions

- Students must **apply online through the official government portal**.
- All required documents (caste certificate, income certificate, Aadhaar, bank details, admission proof, etc.) must be submitted.
- Any false information may lead to **cancellation of benefits**.

Dr. Panjabrao Deshmukh Vasatigruha Nirvaha Bhatta Yojana

This scheme provides financial assistance to needy students who are staying in hostels or private accommodations and whose annual family income is less than ₹8,00,000.

Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Maharashtra Swadhar Yojana

This scheme is applicable to SC and Nav-Buddha students only. The annual family income should be less than or equal to ₹2,50,000. The Aadhaar number must be linked with the bank account.

Students who have not been allotted government hostel accommodation will receive financial assistance for lodging, boarding, and other educational expenses.

Minority Scholarship Scheme

This scholarship is available for students belonging to minority communities such as Muslim, Christian, Sikh, Buddhist, Jain, and Parsi (Zoroastrian).

The annual family income should not exceed ₹2.5 lakh. The student must not be receiving any other government scholarship for the same course. The scholarship is available only to Indian citizens.

Concession in Fees for Freedom Fighter's Wards

Applications must be submitted to the Zilla Parishad Office. The college provides fee concessions as per government rules. Students who fulfill the required educational and economic criteria are eligible.

Students must submit the required forms within the stipulated time, obtain acknowledgment, and preserve it for future reference.

Rajarshi Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj Scholarship

This concession is available for students whose parents' annual income is less than ₹1,00,000. Application forms are available in the college office.

Students must collect the forms before 10th July and submit the duly filled forms through the college to the Zilla Parishad Office before 15th July.

Required Documents:

- i) Income Certificate
- ii) Affidavit of parents (for rural areas with population up to 10,000)
- iii) Income Certificate attested by Z.P. Member or Gazetted Officer
- iv) For urban areas (population above 10,000), income certificate must be issued by a Gazetted Officer, Executive Magistrate, or Tahsildar

Concession in Fees for Secondary Teachers' Wards

This concession is available to students whose parents are secondary teachers (S.S.C., D.Ed., or S.T.C.). Applications must be submitted to the college before 15th July.

Concession fees:

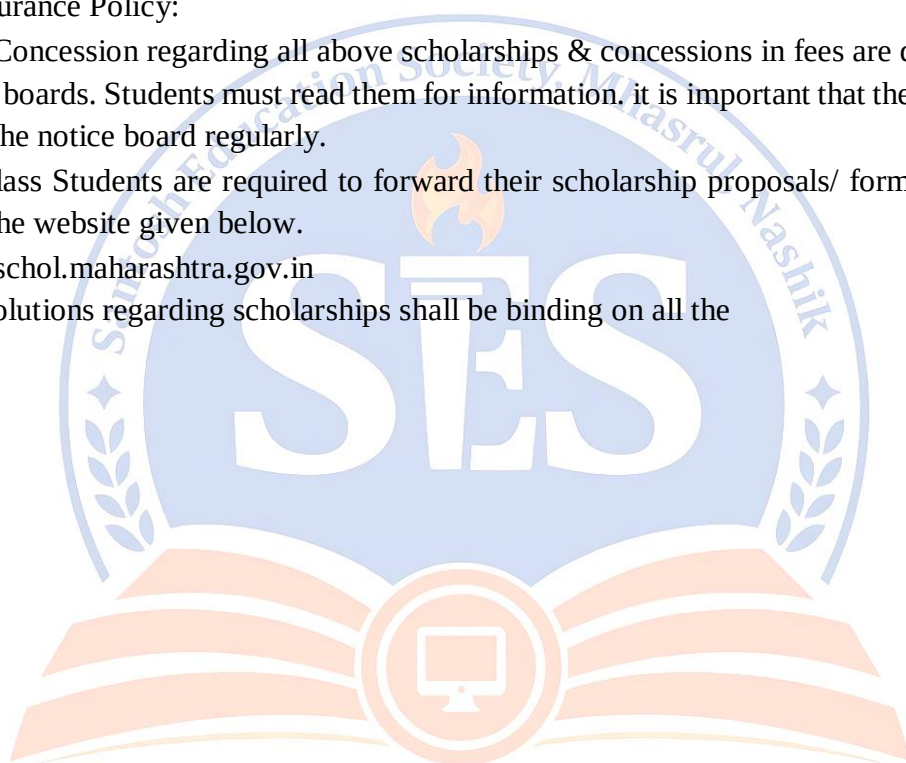
College gives all concessions in fees as directed by the government. Students who fulfill the necessary conditions, both educational economical are given concession in fees. It is the responsibility of the students to fill necessary forms within due dates, to secure acknowledgment and to preserve it for the years.

Rajarshi Shahu Maharaj Scholarship: The concessions for those, whose parent's income is less than Rs.1,00,000/- The prescribed forms are made available in college office. Students can take forms from the office before 10th July.

The duly filled forms must reach the zilla parishad office before 15th July, through college. Following documents must be, attached to the form. Income certificate. Affidavit of the parents (for rural areas: population upto 10,000) Income certificate attested by Z.P. member, Gazette Officer. For students from urban areas (Population more than 10,000) the income certificate must be issued either by gazette officer or Executive Magistrate or Tahsildar.

Concession in Fees for Secondary Teacher's Wards:

- This concession is for the students whose parents are secondary teachers either with S.S.C., D.Ed., or STC. Application should be submitted to college before 15th July.

The Institution shall be under obligation to submit the online proposal with the requisite documents as provided u/s. 14(1)(a) of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015, to approve the fees charged as Ad-hoc fees and further to approve the fees for the academic year 2026-2027 or 2027-2028 as the case may be.
7. No Institution shall charge the fees in any form over and above the Ad-hoc fees declared by the Fees Regulating Authority."

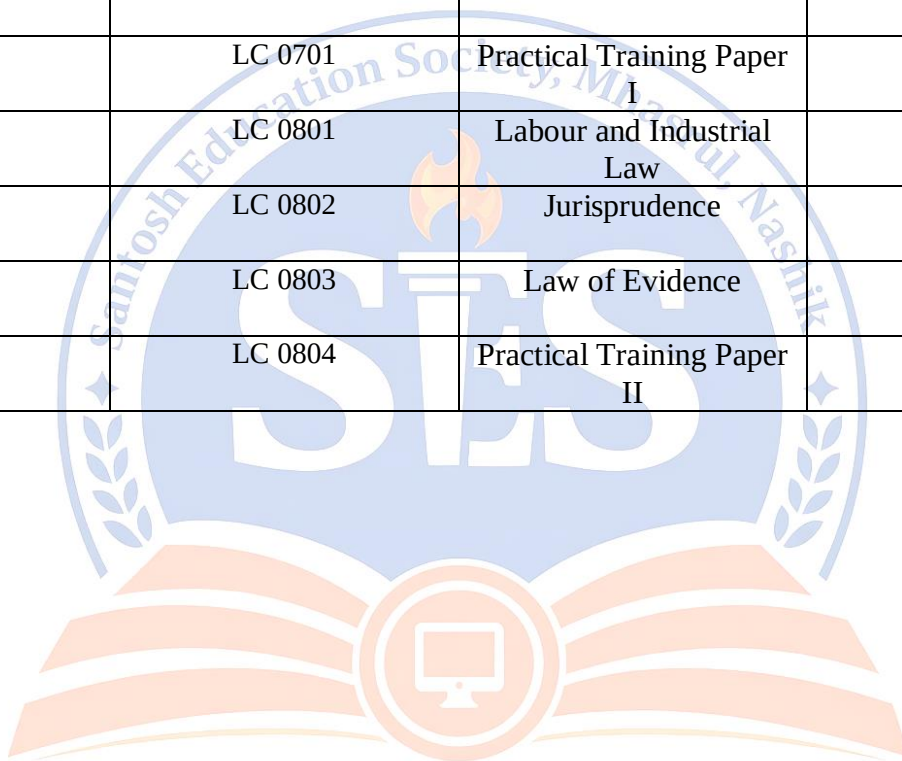

Sexual harassment refers to any unwanted or unwelcome behavior of a sexual nature that makes a person feel offended, humiliated, or intimidated. If a person experiences or witnesses any inappropriate physical, verbal, or non-verbal behavior of a sexual nature, it is considered sexual harassment.

➤ **Examples of sexual harassment include:**

Touching, hugging, or kissing someone without their consent.

Showing or sending sexual pictures, videos, or messages.

Asking for sexual favors in exchange for benefits (such as a job or promotion).

Making inappropriate sexual gestures or staring in a suggestive manner.
